FINANCIAL SANCTIONS NOTICE

Russia

- 1. The International Division of the Attorney General's Chambers advises that fourteen (14) entries have been added to the Russia regime¹ and are now subject to an asset freeze and trust services sanctions.
- 2. Additionally, ten (10) entries have been amended and are still subject to an asset freeze and trust services sanctions.
- 3. This follows an update to the UK Sanctions List. The consolidated list of asset freeze targets has been updated to reflect these changes.

¹ The <u>Russia (Sanctions) (Overseas Territories) Order 2020</u> (Legal Notice 23 of 2021) entered into force for the Islands on 31st December 2020 (the "Principal Order"). The Principal Order was amended pursuant to the Russia (Sanctions) (Overseas Territories) (Amendment) Order 2022, the Russia (Sanctions) (Overseas Territories) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 2022, the Russia (Sanctions) (Overseas Territories) (Amendment) (No. 4) Order 2022 and the Russia (Sanctions) (Overseas Territories) (Amendment) Order 2023, which are in effect for the Islands.
